Major Accountabilities

- Provides counseling and consultation service for victims of domestic violence, including advocacy and follow up.
- Serves as liaison with other service providers.
- Prepares intake and treatment plan for each client.
- Develops and maintains familiarity with trauma-focused issues related to domestic violence victimization.
- Uses knowledge and training in trauma, PTSD, rape trauma syndrome, and the dynamics of domestic violence to educate clients on the effects of violence.
- Use knowledge of psychoeducational techniques to provide clients with the opportunity to develop enhanced coping skills.
- Uses supportive counseling techniques including empathic listening, exploration, and validation of client strengths; draws upon alternative counseling methods including art therapy, bibliotherapy, and social supports to promote client healing.
- Serves as staff on call in rotation with other staff members.
